The South Australian Branch of the Australian Lawyers for Human Rights is delighted to present renowned lawyer Stephen Kenny who will answer these questions and speak about human rights in the context of the ever-present “War on Terror”.

Stephen Kenny acted for Australian Guantanamo Bay detainee David Hicks. He was the first lawyer allowed access to the Naval Base since it began detaining those President Bush declared to be “the worst of the worst”. Kenny’s work ensured that Hicks’ conviction for providing material support to terrorism was set aside early last year. He has been the recipient of numerous awards, including the Law Society Justice Award.
